ORDINANCE # 18

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR PROCESS AND EXECUTION TO ENFORCE JUDGMENTS RENDERED ON CONVICTION OF ANY PERSON FOR A VIOLATION OF ANY ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF CLARK'S FORK, IDAHO, AND FOR THE COLLECTION OF FINES AND COSTS INCLUDED IN SUCH JUDGMENTS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHAIRMAN AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CLARK'S FORK, IDAHO.

Section 1. In rendering judgment upon the conviction of any person for the violation of any of the ordinances of the Village of Clark's Fork, Idaho, the police magistrate may, as a part of the judgment order the commitment of the person convicted until the payment of the fine or costs, or the fine and costs imposed in the case at the rate of \$2.00 per day; provided that commitment shall not in any case be made for more than thirty (30) days.

Section 2. Every able bodied male person over the age of 14 years, who shall be convicted of any violation of any ordinance of the Village of Clark's Fork, Idaho, and who has been committed for default in payment of the fine or costs or fine and costs, may be required by the police magistrate to work at hard labor on the streets of the village of Clark's Fork, Idaho, at the rate of \$2.00 per day for a period of not more than 30 days, which requirement shall be by order of the police magistrate entered as a part of the judgment in said cause.

Section 3. When any male person under 14 years of age, or any woman, or any person disabled from any cause from performing manual labor, is convicted of any violation of any of the ordinances of the Village of Clark's Fork, Idaho, and such

person has been confined not less than three(3) days for default in the payment of fine or costs, or fine and costs, and the police magistrate is satisfied that such person has nothing to pay such fine or costs or fine and costs, he may, with the written consent of a majority of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Clark's Fork, Idaho, discharge such person from imprisonment.

Section 4. The police magistrate shall tax as costs in any action brought before him for violation of the ordinances of said Village, the following fees:-

\$1.00 per day and legal mileage for each witness.

\$1.00 per day for the Village Marshall for the serving of process and attending the trial.

\$6.00 as the fees of the police magistrate for trying said cause.

Section 5. All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force after its passage and approval and its publication once in the Clark's Fork Times a newspaper published at <sup>Clark's Fork</sup> Sandpoint, Bonner County, Idaho, the same being a newspaper of general circulation in the Village of Clark's Fork, Idaho, ~~there being no newspaper published in said Village.~~
